Order of the White Carnation

At the 1975 Convention, Delta Chi established the Order of the White Carnation to honor those men who have displayed meritorious and inconspicuous service. Awards of the honor of membership in the Order of the White Carnation are granted by a Convention only after the selection, recommendation and approval of the then members of the Order. At the 51st International Convention, **Fred** was bestowed the honor of membership in the Order. Fred has served his undergraduate chapter as house manager, IFC representative, "C", and "A". Upon graduation, he worked as a leadership consultant for the International Headquarters. In the years that followed, Fred was Vice-President of the Oklahoma Chapter ABT; following the passing of the ABT president, Fred took hold of the reigns. Fred currently serves as Vice-President of the S.M.U. Chapter ABT and House Corporation. On the International level, he has held office as "CC" (1982-1985) and as "AA" (1985-1987). In 1990 he was elected President of the Educational Foundation, a position that he continues to hold. For his exceptional financial support, Fred has also been named as a New Founder. Delta Chi is honored to call him "Brother."

The latest recipient, Dave Westol, meets and exceeds the qualifications for this award. Dave is a graduate of Michigan State University and has served as Rush Chairman, Marshal, IFC Vice President and President, Regional Counselor and National Vice President of Theta Chi. Using his law degree and experiences as Executive Director and attorney, Dave has delivered his trademark "Hazing on Trial" over 770 times at over 300 campuses and over 100 national fraternity and sorority conventions.
